Spiritual Reformation: Worship

Main Point

The call of Malachi 1 is a call to reformation of our worship.

Key Ideas

What does it mean to worship God as we ought?

- 1. Know His Love (v. 2-5)
 - No matter what experience we have in life we can know God's love.
 - It is the sovereign grace of God that numbers us among those to whom God expresses his love.
 - It is the death of Christ that settles the love of God on us. The cross is the pulpit of the love of God.
 - If we doubt God's love we will be spiritually adrift. If we trust his love we'll know it and live in the good of it.
- 2. Honor His Name (v. 6-14)
 - God is after the glory of his name (v.14)
 - God rebukes the people for giving him only those things that are worthless to them.
 - To God, not worshipping at all is better than just going through the motions of worship. He would rather have them shut the door of the temple than use it in an unholy manner.
 - We know that God calls us to obey him for our good. When our obedience results in our good he receives honor to his name.
 - The only way God's name will be exalted among the nations is when he is exalted among his people.
