Text: Isaiah 40:12-26

Main Point: We can be comforted by the power of the Gospel, because God is God and His ways are sure.

• There is a direct relationship between our knowledge of God and our ability to experience His comfort.

Key Ideas

Five truths God reveals about himself that are a source of comfort.

- 1. God is Gloriously Mighty (verse 12).
- He is stronger and more powerful than we can imagine.
- 2. God is independently wise (verses 13-14).
- He knows exactly what we need and he makes no mistakes.
- 3. God is unapproachably Holy (verse 16).
- He provided the way for us to draw near through Christ's atoning death.
- 4. God is incomparably unique (verses 18-20).
- No one and nothing else can give eternal comfort.
- 5. God is eternally Sovereign (verses 21-26).
- He stands outside of time and stands over all of creation as Lord and King.
- Everything is in subjection to Him.
