Restoration for the Journey

February 28, 2010 lan McConnell

Text: Psalm 126

Main Point: Our merciful God is the Restorer of what we lose.

Key Ideas: This is a 'Psalm of Ascents' which was sung by God's people on their way to worship. It was sung so that people would remember God's past deliverances as they faced present problems.

Have you ever seen God work mightily in the past, but are struggling to believe that God can do a mighty work now? Do you need to sing a Psalm of Ascents?

- 1. Recalling God's grace in the past builds faith for the trials of the present (v. 1-3).
 - Don't ever forget the times when God has turned things around in your life for good.
 - God often restores our circumstances. But his deepest restoration is the restoration of our souls.
 - Whenever God puts things right that were wrong, it is a call to celebration.
- 2. Recalling God's grace in the past presses us to move forward in expectant prayer (v. 4-6).
 - Prayer is the act of applying God's promises to circumstances that need his restoration.
 - Sometimes God's restoration is a sudden event like streams flowing in the desert (v.4).
 - Sometimes God's restoration is a process like reaping after a long season of faithful sowing (v. 5-6).
 - Don't despair the process or grow weary in prayer. The promise is always for ultimate restoration.
 - Those who know Jesus the Restorer, are guaranteed to experience His ultimate restoration.

 - Conviction in response to God's word preached.
 - Other.
- 4. When God restores something in our lives the temptation can be to simply say, 'wow, I'm glad that's over' and move onto the next burden. How can we make sure we are properly celebrating God's restoration acts?
- 5. Is there any place where you are waiting for God's restoration and are growing weary in prayer?
