Judas the Betrayer

Text John 13:18-30

Marty Machowski June 30, 2013 Main Point: The purpose of Christ cannot be thwarted by the plans of the Enemy

Key Ideas

This passage highlights two important truths about how Jesus deals with the evil in our hearts and in the world.

- 1. You can't hide your sin from God
 - The text clearly shows that the other disciples had no awareness of Judas' intention to betray Christ. Only Jesus knew this. And still Jesus washed Judas' feet (13:1-17).
 - Let's not fool ourselves into thinking that if we hide our sin from others it is also hidden from God. God knows everything and it is foolish to think we can live in hiding from him.
 - The good news is that Jesus didn't come into the world bringing light for condemnation. He came bringing light to dark places for the purpose of saving sinners!
- 2. The Lord knows the enemy's plans
 - Satan's plan was to defeat Jesus using the sinful propensities of man's heart. But Jesus purpose was to defeat sin and the devil through the cross.
 - The devil is still at work lying and destroying. But he is not defeating the activity of God. Even the devil's activity is part of what God uses to work all things together for His good (Romans 8).
 - When it comes to the temptations of the evil one we are called to stand in the armor of God (Eph. 6).

1. What are some things you see the evidence of God overcoming the work of the enemy in the world around you?


Grow: Application to stir our obedience to Christ
