- 1. Pray. Ask God for his help to keep your conversation fruitful and redemptive. If, at any point during the conversation you feel conflict brewing, stop, pray, and remember together that Christ means to be the center of the marriage and the conversation, not a conflict.
- 2. Take the time to share your answers from Question 1 in Part II. Realize that God may have spoken to each of you in different ways, seeking to address different things. Don't correct or critique. Simply inform and share God's activity during the message.
- 3. Review your answers to Questions 2 and 3 from Part II. Seek to learn from the differences you may discover and pray for one another in accordance with the answers you each share.
- 4. Pray. Ask God to strengthen you with the might of his power as he fills your marriage with his Spirit. Ask him to forgive you for your contribution to any challenges and thank him for bringing you together as a couple. Pray that God would provide all of the help you need.
